**JDAI Presentation - Shelly Hug and Tom Warren**

- Updates: ATD is working on 4 new alternatives (in home crisis response, intensive family preservation, community coaching, and respite care) and looking at reasons youth are detained with respect to reasons for violations
- Case processing: looking at 2-tier warrant system
- Data: 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter QRS
- JDAI conference: highlight was the QRS report and the work that had gone into that (Douglas County is the only site using the full report)
- Monday: statewide collaborative meeting in Lincoln making recommendations in each district to lower override rates (RAI) and consideration of expansion into Cass and Otoe county

- General overview: started in Douglas County in 2011 and have seen reductions in detention numbers by about half.

### **Georgetown University program - Greg**

- Group of 10 cross-disciplinary folks who went to DC
- Georgetown has the School Justice Partnership Program—total of about 75 people there
  - Rich discussion of SBAs
  - Paradigm shift: test scores don't matter
  - Here in DC we're doing a good job but we'll need some thick skin over the next year as far as increased collaboration between schools, security, and police—there's a lot to be done in terms of interventions that could be done in DC and it's really all about working together
    - Blackburn and South will be part of the capstone program
  - Teamwork will be key and we need everybody to be at the table and check yourself at the door

### **State of the System**

Dr. Miller presented the current rendition of the State of the System document. The State of the System document is a product of the JDAI Data Committee that Dr. Miller 'volunteered' to compile.

Dr. Miller held several review meetings with numerous juvenile justice stakeholders over the past several weeks in preparation for the OYS Steering Committee review.

The OYS Steering Committee had numerous revision suggestions. This valuable feedback has been implemented into the most current rendition of the State of the System document. The JDAI collaborative will review this rendition and provide suggestions.
