Category One Consulting – School Reentry Evaluation Findings:

- Presentation – Dr. Sara Roberts, Category One
  - Power Point presentation
    - Question, related to the Reentry Definition utilized for the project - Does this include disruption due to confinement – yes, confinement is included in the category of out-of-home-placement.
    - Question – inclusion of Blackburn/Parish in listing. Programming components fit definition utilized for the research methodology. Other districts contacted self-identified they did not fit the definition. Project team adhered to consistent scope, definition and protocol.
    - Question - Transition from Youth Center to community. Staff assisting transition at DCYC – formerly a SPA with OPS. Now DCYC transition specialist assists with. DCYC has access to Infinite Campus, online learning other tools – collaborates with OPS.
    - Question – how long does a student placed at Blackburn remain there?
    - Question – graduation rate from Blackburn? Membership mentioned continuous improvement under new administration.
    - Question - How included/excluded in/from the list of programs – refer to the process outlined in presentation.
    - Question – Did any program stand out as a particularly good model? D2 Center, a holistic approach. Well integrated with the school districts, good professional relationships. Barrier - Unable to work proactively, respond reactively after school disruption has occurred. Is a voluntary program.
    - Question – how does discipline policy impact youth push out? – Policies have loosened from Zero Tolerance policies of past. Capstone project addresses school response in this way – less punitive approach.
    - Question – ESSA – (Every Student Succeeds Act), SME – (Subject Matter Expert)
    - Question – Are programs on the list currently tracking outcomes – yes, but lack capacity for tracking thorough outcome measures.
    - Question – Cultural competence – this was identified through self-report.
