

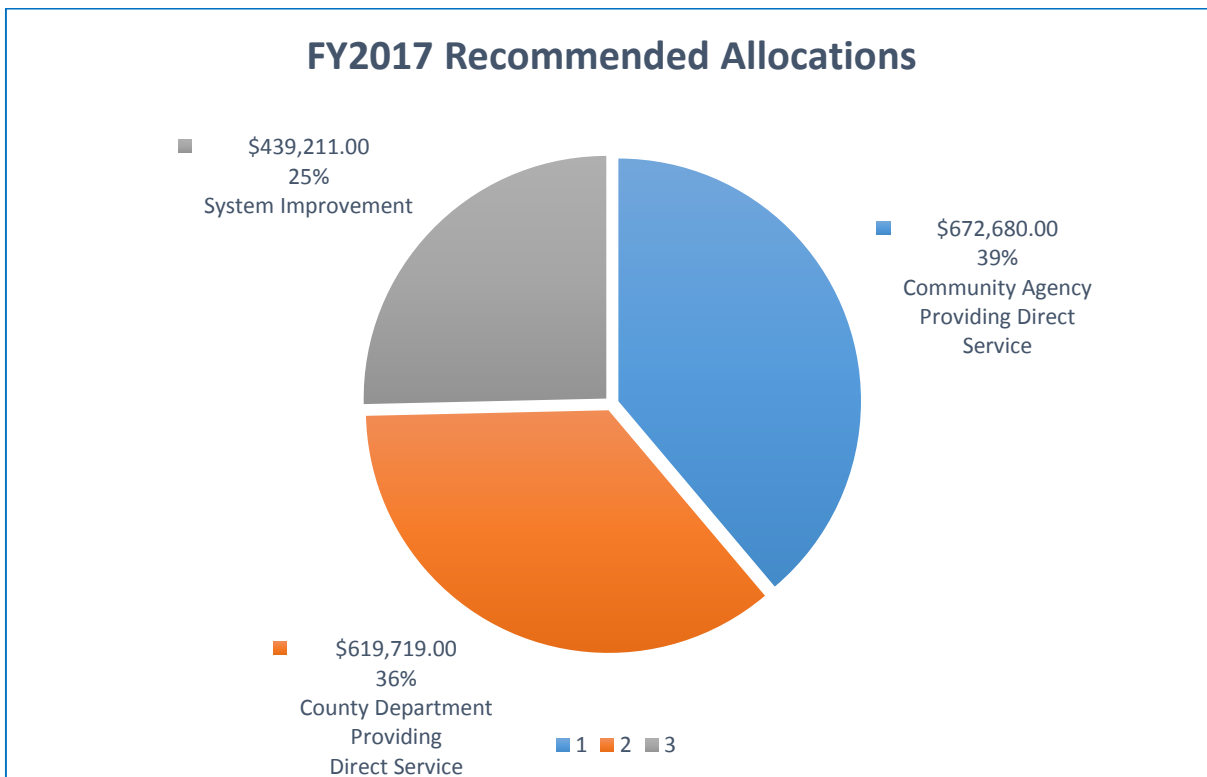
## FY2017 Community-based Juvenile Services Aid Recommendation Process Summary

Notice of the application period was announced on 10/04/2016 and shared via Operation Youth Success and the Juvenile Detention Alternatives Initiative work groups, the Juvenile Justice Provider Forum & Douglas County departments. Applicants had until 11/21 to submit applications to the County Grants office.

The first level review team considered each application independently (12/2 – 12/12) and then met 12/12 to discuss and prepare a recommendation to the Community Team. During the review process the team considered the total award available to Douglas County: \$1,731,610.00 and compared this to the total funds requested: \$2,059,316.00, or an overage of \$327,706.00. Applications were considered based upon guidance provided within the *Douglas County Distribution of Community-based Juvenile Services Aid* (est. 7/2016) and as governed in statute, via Title 75, Nebraska Administrative Code, Chapter 1, Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Community-based Juvenile Services Aid Program, Rules and Regulations for Distribution of Community-based Juvenile Services Aid.

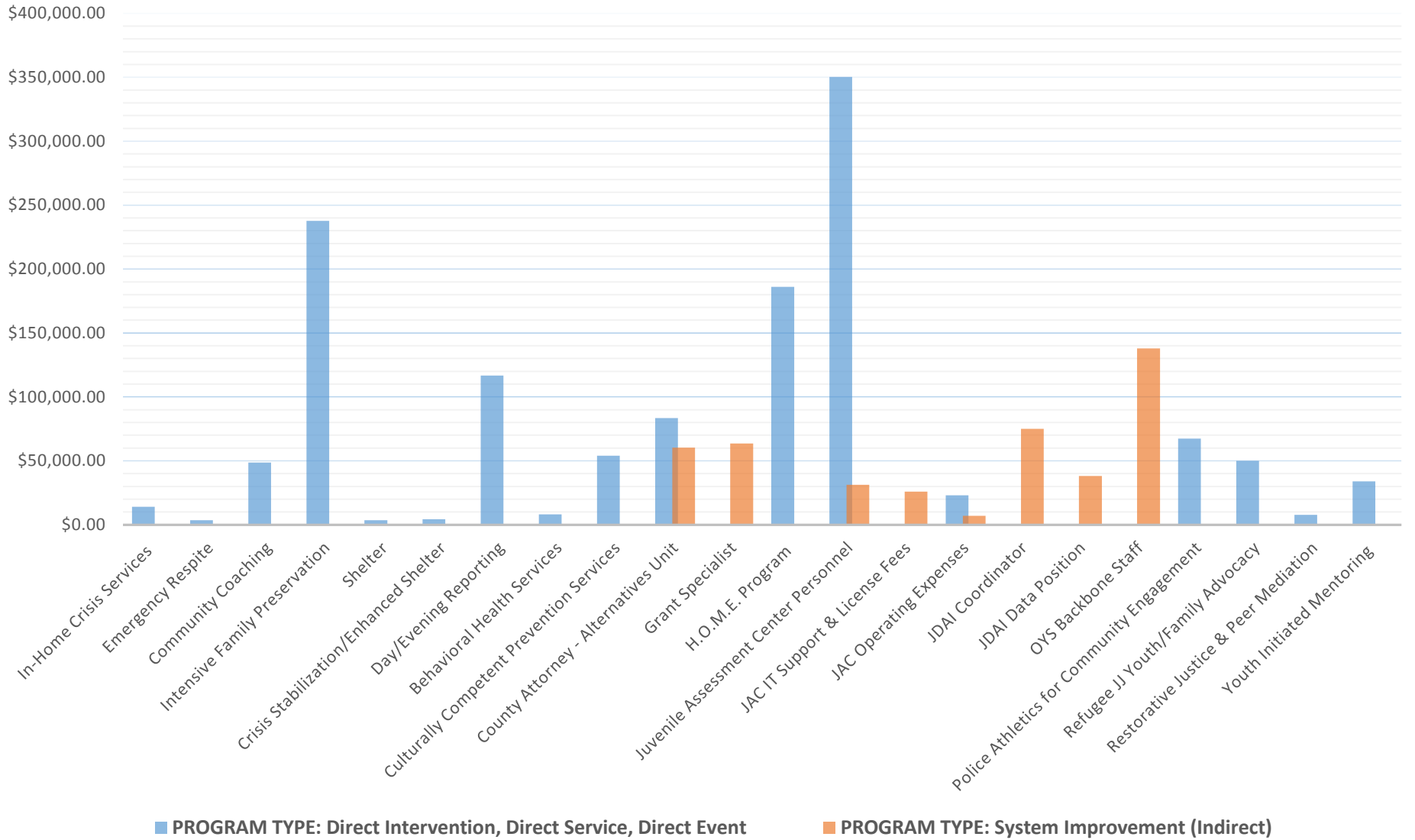
The approved recommendation of the OYS Steering Committee (12/15), summarized herein, will be submitted to the Nebraska Crime Commission (NCC).

Upon receipt of the award notice from the Nebraska Crime Commission, the award will be presented to the Douglas County Board of Commissioners for approval. Contracts for services supported by FY2017 Community Based Juvenile Services Aid will be entered into upon approval by both the Nebraska Crime Commission and the Douglas County Board.



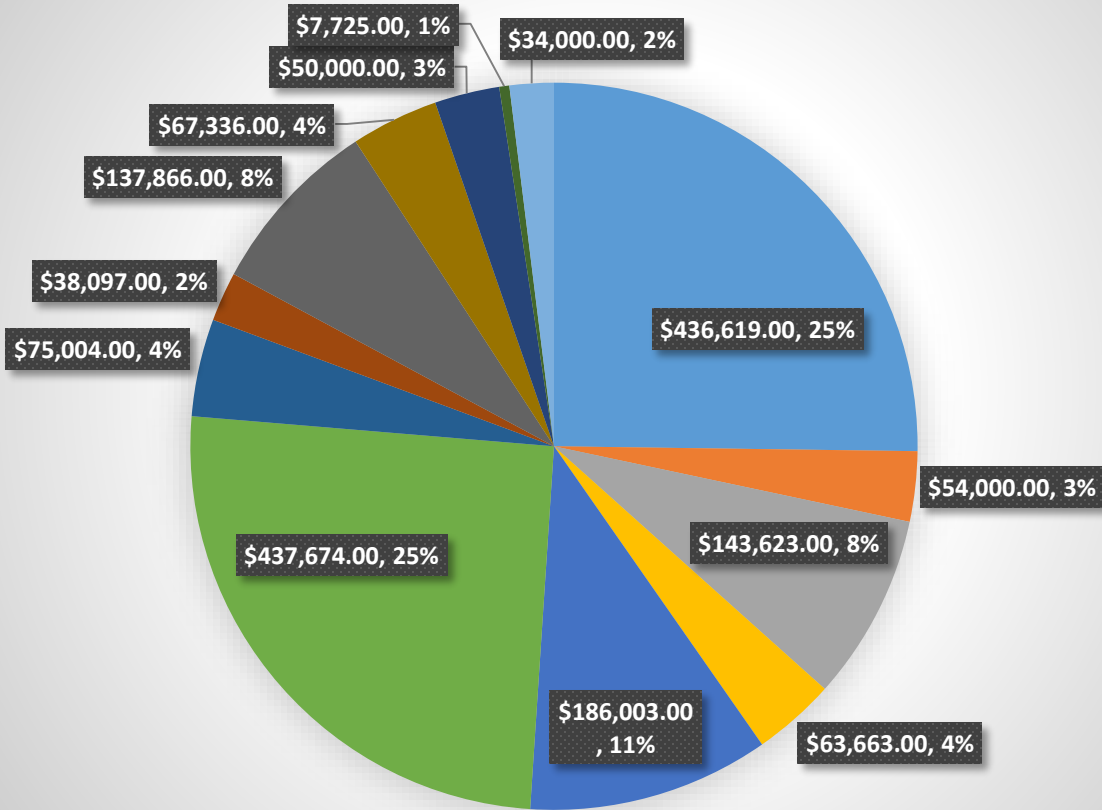
