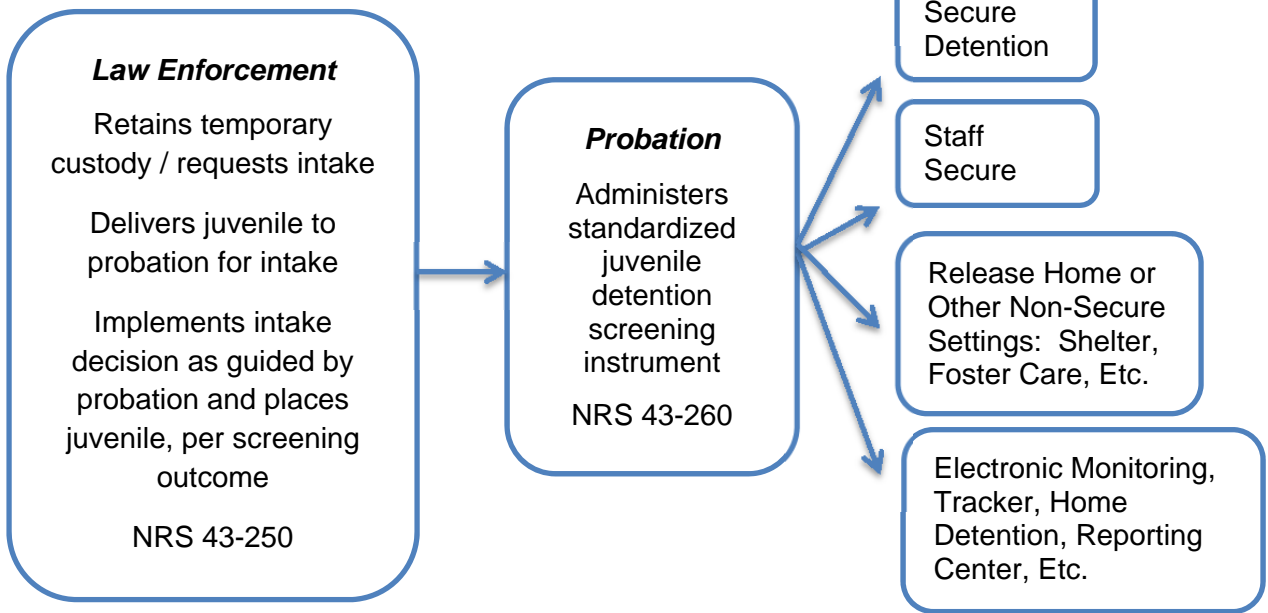


Juvenile Justice System Process and Service Responsibility

INTAKE



PRE-ADJUDICATION

County Responsibility

- Costs include, but are not limited to, secure and staff secure detention, services, community based detention alternatives, treatment, voluntary services, and transportation

Probation Responsibility [§]

- Costs include evaluations and out-of-home placements that are not detention
- Supervision if ordered
- Juvenile who has a current disposition to probation and is alleged to have committed a new violation or is subject to a motion to revoke probation

POST ADJUDICATION

Probation Responsibility [§]

- Targeted Services, Placement, Detention, and Supervision as ordered by the court
 - *Twenty-one day detention evaluations*
 - *Thirty day community based evaluations*

Juvenile Justice System Process and Service Responsibility

POST DISPOSITION YRTC PLACEMENT / PROBATION TERM

DHHS / Office of Juvenile Services (OJS) Responsibility

Upon commitment all issues related to care and custody of juvenile until discharged, including but not limited to court appearances and furloughs, and detention costs upon order of commitment and transportation to and from the YRTCs

Notice 60 Days Prior to Discharge and Again

Re-entry Plan Submission 30 Days Prior to Release

Probation Responsibility [§]

During Commitment

- Family Team Meetings
 - Re-entry Planning
- Community Supervision

Upon Discharge

- Targeted Services/Placement and Supervision
 - Substance Use
 - Other Treatment
 - Non-Treatment
 - Out of Home Placements

[§] PROBATION RESPONSIBILITY/PAYMENT OPTIONS

To promote parental responsibility and provide for the most equitable use / availability of public money the court may assess the cost of placement or detention in whole or part to the parent(s) of the juvenile.

Probation will consider parental fund, private or public insurance, entitlements, grants, etc. prior to the authorization of state appropriated monies.

While probation has care and placement authority for juveniles being supervised, they do not assume custody. Therefore the legal custodian retains certain rights and responsibilities, including but not limited to, provision and decisions surrounding education, morality, religion, discipline, and medical care.
