The purpose of the OYS Community Lending Library is to provide research-based curriculum to organizations and agencies serving middle or high school students. We want to enhance community collaboration by providing service providers with a free and easy option to promote the health and well-being of our youth. Curriculum topics include Teen Challenges & Choices, Essential Health, Mental Health, and Career Options.

You can borrow 1 curriculum at a time. The lending period may vary from title to title. However, we ask that you contact us if you need to borrow the items over 30 days. You can also borrow the curriculum again, but please allow 30 days in between last check out so others may take advantage of this great opportunity.

1. Name and Title
2. Organization
3. Email address
4. Curriculum you would like to borrow
5. Number of youth you will serve

These items can then be picked up and returned at the University of Nebraska-Omaha Community Engagement Center (CEC) located at 6001 Dodge Street (CEC 117B), Monday through Friday (except on holidays) from 10:00 am - 3:30 pm. If you need to make special arrangements outside these hours, please call 402-554.5957 to set-up a date and time.

If the item you are requesting is unavailable at the time, you will receive an email notification and a follow-up message when the item becomes available. Once they follow-up email is sent, you will have 5 business days to pick up the item. If you are unable to pick up the item, please contact us or your hold will be cancelled.

OYS Community Lending Library will send out overdue reminders after 30 days and if borrower has not contacted OYS staff. At this point, we do not fine for any overdue material.
